- In the 2015/6 cohort there were six pupils of which two qualified as pupil premium and took the Maths, Reading and GPS SATs tests. Writing was not a test and was Teacher Assessed. Depending on the outcome of the teacher assessment there was then a standardised score allocated to the child.
- In comparison to the pupils who are not Pupil Premium the outcomes for the Pupil Premium pupils are in line with them. From the statistics writing was highlighted as an area for development for all pupils and focus for this has been planned for in the proposed Pupil Premium expenditure for 2016/7.
- Attendance of pupils eligible for pupil premium is good. Attendance percentage for 2015/ is 95.57%. This is in line with the national attendance figures for all primary school pupils. The positive attendance figures indicate that Pupil Premium children enjoy learning at Redmarley C of E Primary Academy.
- Pupil Premium pupils have been supported when attending Breakfast Club. This has been 5 out of 10 pupils have attended Breakfast Club.
- Pupil Premium pupils have been supported when attending School Trips. This has been a 50% reduction on the price and on occasions if a family has not been able to pay then the full amount has been committed from Pupil Premium. This has resulted in pupils who are in receipt of Pupil Premium experiencing enriched curriculum activities enabling them to be fully engaged in their learning.
